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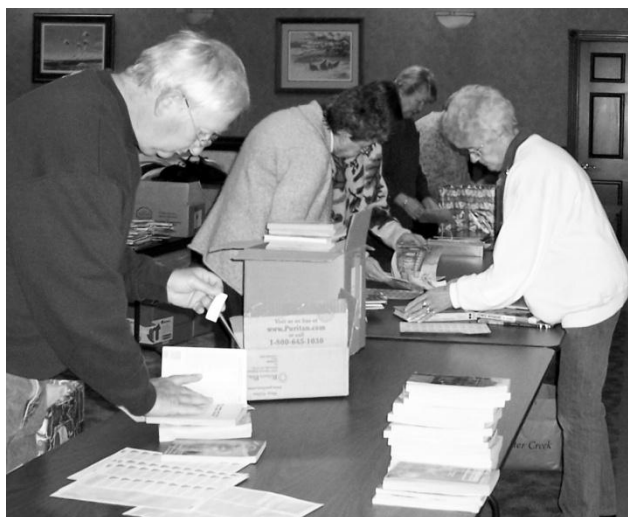

The final day for the public to place books in boxes is December 2nd; our volunteers will be picking up the boxes of books on or after that date. Last year LV-MC President Vicki Huffman estimated well over 1,800 books were given away.

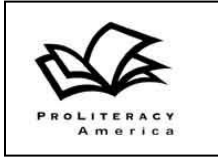

Tutoring--There are 2 volunteer tutors working with school age children—Bette Whitrock and Gordon Fabian. Two volunteers are on hiatus with their students—Barbara Church and Jess Bruckner. Pat Johnson’s two adult basic literacy students have not yet returned from break. There is a need for a tutor volunteer in Neshkoro. One GED student has shown interest, but has not yet been tested at the Job Center.

Library Story Time at the Montello Public Library—Judy Schelble began the program again mid-September, but there will be a winter break December-January due to decrease in attendance during those months.

September 8, 2011

Meeting was called to order at 7:03 p.m. Motion by LuAnn, seconded by Marj to accept the Secretary's report as written. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report was presented by Vicki for the 2010-2011 fiscal year. We showed total income of \$6,268.71 and total expenses of \$6,276.42. Our cash balance currently is \$3,087.67 and our CD balance is \$3,000.36.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

International Literacy Day Essay Contest Winners: Vicki read the winning essays in 3 age groups with the theme, "Why I Love to Read." 11& under: Creed Leofilos, Montello, and Maddi Vetter, Endeavor, tied. 12-17 years old: Tiffany Buchholz, Westfield. 18 & over: Linda Wachholz, Montello. Winners get a \$15 gift card to either Book World or Barnes & Noble. We had 20 entries. Judges were Kathleen McGwin, Sue Hunter and Bruce Dethlefsen. Funding was provided by Alliant Energy Foundation, Dollar General Literacy Foundation and Verizon, through Wisconsin Literacy, Inc.

Public Relations: Newsletters – 369 mailed 11/24/10; 368 mailed 3/9/11; 360 mailed 5/16/11; 363 mailed 8/22/11. Ads & Articles – There have been 11 ads and/or articles & photos published in the *Marquette County Tribune*. Topics included Tots to Teens Book Drive, February hors d'oeuvre fund raiser, "Kid Stuff" and International Literacy Day Writing Contest. One article also appeared in the *Princeton Times Republic*.

Website – We have had updated newsletter entries posted by Jess Bruckner since 2010. International Literacy Day/Month 2011 – We had the essay contest on "Why I Love Reading." (See results above)

Health Literacy Pamphlet – LuAnn created a tri-fold pamphlet with health literacy facts for use with parents and public health nurses. Some were available at the Marquette County Fair, as well as "Kid Stuff."

Materials Report: No teaching materials were ordered this year.

Audit Report: Emily Roidt-Stevenson conducted the audit and reported everything appears to be in balance.

Board Development & Nominating: All present officers will continue for a 1-year term. Lee Ann Casper is moving in 2012, but will stay on for 1 year. Judy Schelble and Barbara Church agreed to 3-year terms, ending in 2014. Bette Schneider agreed to a 1-year term.

Program Committee: Fiscal year tutoring – 22 volunteers, including 5 tutors, reported a total of 959 hours, an increase of 28 hours. This includes 81 direct tutoring hours from 7/1/10 to 6/30/11, a decrease of 51 tutoring hours, plus 878 other volunteer hours, including travel time and lesson preparation.

This past year we lost Barb Rowe due to her move to Oshkosh, but gained Jess Bruckner. Volunteers assisted again at both Forest Lane (2) and St. John's (2). Other volunteers were prepared to assist teachers at Forest Lane; however, schedules could not be coordinated.

At this time, we have 3 students enrolled in the Basic Literacy program; one is a Westfield HS student. Barbara continues with her now junior high Montello student. No students left the program this year, although one was on a year's hiatus.

LVMC also presented a new health literacy curriculum with the aid of a state grant. Ten Head Start parents and 2 private students completed this curriculum. During the past summer at the Oxford Library, new volunteer Bette Schneider offered a group tutoring "boot camp" for middle school students to help improve reading skills.

Library Story Time at the Montello Public Library enjoyed a big boost in attendance because of the move to Friday mornings. An estimated 20 students arrived to hear Judy or the librarian read most months during these sessions. Fewer attended during the winter months.

WIC – We continue to refresh the books at both the Montello and Westfield book carts.

WI Bookworm – HCE has committed to providing 64 book sets for the upcoming school year. Vicki and Pat will again prepare activities for each month, with the help of other volunteers.

Kid Stuff – Three LVMC volunteers again read to children at the Head Start Open house on August 30th. Partners were

LVMC, the new Marquette Co. Head Start located adjacent to Oxford Elementary School, Marquette County: Health Dept., Human Services, Sheriff's Dept., EMS, WIC, and Birth to 3.

Tots to Teens Book Drive – Once again MANY books were collected for this year's annual Tots to Teens Book Drive. Because of the weather, many books were left over. Many were added to the WIC self-service book carts.

(Bette Whitrock was excused to leave)

Resource Committee: Our major fund raiser, the Hors D'Oeuvre Buffet held at Mekan River Lodge on the first Thursday of February, netted \$2,101 versus \$1,984 for 2010. Attendance was up slightly, with 96 tickets sold versus 94 for 2010. Capacity is 100.

Additional donations during the year included \$175 from businesses, \$640 from grants (WI Literacy), and \$620 from individuals. Annually we list donors in the spring newsletter.

Dues Increase From \$10 to \$15: Policy 1 (1) will increase our yearly dues to \$15 for the Program Year July 1st through June 30th. This proposal was printed in our last newsletter. Motion by LuAnn, seconded by Pat to approve the two changes in the policy. Motion carried.

Motion by Lu Ann, seconded by Marj to approve slate as presented. Motion carried.

Budget Approval: Vicki presented a proposed budget for 7/1/11 through 6/30/11. Income: \$3,100 Contributions & Events; \$100 Grants; \$435 Membership Dues. Total = \$3,635

Expenses: \$500 Books, Teaching Materials; \$900 Publicity & Promotion; \$700 Supplies; \$185 Memberships, State Fees; \$400 Contracted Services/Software Support; \$220 Insurance;

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\$600 Tutor Training, Conferences, Travel; \$100 Mileage to Volunteers. Total = \$3,605

Incomes, grants, and dues were adjusted to reflect our expectations for this year. We will not need our major book purchases, like the *Read For Joy* and other give-aways because a supply was just purchased recently. Motion by LuAnn, seconded by Jess to accept the budget. Motion carried.

The next board meeting will be November 10th at 9:00 a.m. at Café Hilltop in Montello.

Vicki called for adjournment at 7:42 p.m.

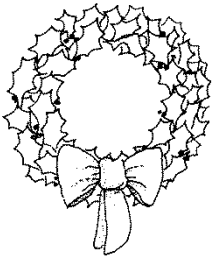
