Family Connections Coalition

The Marquette County Family Connections Coalition held a Life Course Model training in Montello. It was an hour and a half course led by Nate Luedke. It addressed Public Health service gaps and redundancy. Several Marquette County services were represented, including health services, family living, social services and Literacy Volunteers.

Vicki Huffman, Pat Johnson and LuAnn Ziemann represented Literacy Volunteers at the meeting. Our services provide information and referrals for our student-learners and help them read and interpret materials referencing subjects covered by the varying social services within Marquette County.

Regional Literacy Meeting

On Friday, May 6, Vicki Huffman attended a Southwest/South Central Regional meeting at the Literacy Network in Madison. The group was led by Georgia Lieber of Wisconsin Literacy, Inc. The meeting focused on a discussion of Career Pathways and RISE (Regional Industry Skills Education) and the need for matching our students with industry. Due to the diverse nature of our group (representatives from both small and large literacy organizations plus Madison Area Technical College), the discussion was lively and informative.

Once again our good fortune was revealed by LV-MC's successful collaborations within our county, which contributes to the purposeful education of each learner we strive to assist. And once again I thank the libraries, County Health Department, Head Start, UW Extension, Job Center, HCE and the entire community that supports our all-volunteer efforts.

TUTORING: How to Teach Students to Read and Spell Sight Words

A learner may not have the ability to sound out certain words that occur in reading. These words can be taught as sight words. Here's a way to teach sight words that involves touching as well as seeing and hearing. It works with most students and is invaluable to those who are kinesthetic learners.

For each word, you'll need a sheet of 8½"x11" unlined paper and a crayon or marker--something that makes a wide line.

1. Divide the paper into two pieces by cutting it in half lengthwise.
2. On one piece, write the word in large letters across the long dimension.
3. Have the student trace the word with his/her forefinger while saying the word. Repeat this 3-4 times.
4. Cover or remove the word.
5. Have the student write the word on the top of the second piece of paper across the narrow width so that it can be reused.
6. Ask the student to check his/her spelling by looking at the word you wrote on the first paper. If he/she has made a mistake, go on to steps 7-9. If he/she wrote it correctly, skip to steps 10-12.
7. Ask the student to fold down the top of his/her paper to cover the incorrect word. Don't let him/her make corrections by erasing or changing parts of the incorrect word. In this exercise, the word is always written as a whole.
8. Have the student trace the large print sample again while saying the word.
9. Cover or remove the sample. Have the student write the word again on the second sheet of paper. Repeat the above steps as often as necessary until the student can write the word correctly.

10. Type or print the learned words onto small cards.

11. Have the student alphabetize both the small cards and the large pieces of paper in separate files. Use the small cards for drills. Have two sets, so that the student can take one home for practice.

12. Keep the pieces of paper if you have to reteach the word. Once the word is mastered, you or the student can discard the paper.

13. Remember that when the student forgets a word, he/she should retrace it until he/she can write it from memory without looking at the original word. A student should never copy the word.



Techniques for Visual Problems

Visual perception problems make it difficult for the learner to detect differences in forms, letters and words, and to retain a full mental image of what they have seen. Here are some ways a tutor can help:

- Be sure the student has had a visual exam;
- Use color for visual impact--print on colored paper or cover with colored transparencies
- Select materials with simple visual layouts, including large print and much white space;
- Use visual cues--highlighting, underlining
- Cover everything on page except the activity being worked on
